All incoming fifth graders should read <u>at least one chapter book</u> of their choosing. After reading your book, <u>choose one</u> of the formats below to create a book talk that will be presented at the start of the school year. Be sure to follow all directions for completing your book talk.

Below is a list of suggested titles, if you are looking for a recommendation, however, you do not have to choose a book from this list for your poster.

<u>Option 1: Google Slides Book Talk</u>: Create a Google Slides presentation, based on your reading of your chosen book. You may choose the layout, fonts, colors, and images that you include, however, to receive full credit, you must have all of the required slides with all of the listed criteria.

- Slide 1: title and author of your book, a picture of the book's cover, your first and last name, your grade
- Slide 2: an objective summary of the book just the basics, no opinions
- Slide 3: a detailed description of the main character and an image that represents that character, based on the novel, as well as an explanation of why the symbol you chose represents the character.
 - For example, if you read Harry Potter, the image representing him might be his glasses or a lightning bolt.
- Slide 4: Your most and least favorite parts of the book and why

• Slide 5: Would you recommend this book to your classmates? Why or why not?

Option 2: Flipgrid Book Talk: Go to the link below and record a flipgrid video that includes all of the following information, based on your reading of your chosen novel. You may get creative with your selfie, the sticker options, and the other editing choices available, but in order to receive full credit, you need to include ALL of the following criteria as part of your video.

NOTE: There is a 10 minute time limit for your video, so it may be helpful to take notes before you start recording to make sure you use your time effectively.

If you are a new student to St. Agnes and want to choose this option for your book talk, you will be able to record your video once your St. Agnes account is set up. In the meantime, you can prepare your notes for what you will say in your video.

- 1. Click this link: 5th Grade Summer Reading Flipgrid
- 2. Include the following criteria in your video:
 - a. Your first and last name, your grade
 - b. The title and author of the book
 - c. A summary of the book
 - d. Your most and least favorite character in the novel and why
 - e. Would you recommend this book to a classmate? Why or why not?
