# Saint John XXIII, Pope

Tomorrow marks the feast day for St. John XXIII. Few people had as great an impact on the 20th century as Pope John XXIII (Giuseppe Roncalli). As the leader of the Catholic Church in the early 1960's, Pope John XXIII assembled a council of 2,000+ bishops and thousands of sisters, laymen and laywomen to four sessions at St. Peter's 1962-1965. This Second Basilica between Vatican Council was assembled as a means in which to consider changes in the religious practices of the faith and its cultural view in the modern world. The work of the Council laid a foundation for the church as we know it today.
