The Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe


Yesterday our faith community honored the extraordinary miracle of Our Lady of Guadalupe. This story begins with a poor Indian named Juan Diego, who lived in a small village near Mexico City, was on his way to a nearby barrio to attend Mass in honor of Our Lady. As he was walking by a hill called Tepeyac, a radiant cloud appeared, and within it stood an Indian maiden dressed like an Aztec princess. The lady spoke to him in his own language and sent him to the bishop of Mexico. Juan Diego asked the bishop was to build a chapel in the place where the lady appeared. The bishop told Juan to have the lady give him a sign. The lady found Juan and provided roses for Juan to carry to the bishop in his cape or tilma. On December 12, when Juan Diego opened his tilma in the bishop's presence, the roses fell to the ground, and the bishop sank to his knees. On the tilma where the roses had been appeared a likeness of Mary exactly as she had appeared at the hill of Tepeyac.
