Ash Wednesday and the Lenten

Today marks the beginning of our Lenten journey. During the next six weeks, we use this blessed season as an opportunity to re-nourish ourselves through prayer, fasting and almsgiving.

Below are a couple of frequently asked questions about Lent:

Q. Why do we say that there are forty days of Lent? When you count all the days from Ash Wednesday through Holy Saturday, there are 46.

<u>A.</u> It might be more accurate to say that there is the "forty day fast within Lent." Historically, Lent has varied from a week to three weeks to the present configuration of 46 days. The forty day fast, however, has been more stable. The Sundays of Lent are certainly part of the Time of Lent, but they are not prescribed days of fast and abstinence.

Q. So does that mean that when we give something up for Lent, such as candy or sweets, we can have it on Sundays?

<u>A.</u> Apart from the prescribed days of fast and abstinence on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, and the days of abstinence every Friday of Lent, Catholics have traditionally chosen additional penitential practices for the whole Time of Lent. These practices are disciplinary in nature and often more effective if they are continuous, i.e., kept on Sundays as well. That being said, such practices are not regulated by the Church, but by individual conscience.

Leadership Saint of the Week

St. Gabriel of Our Lady of Sorrows was born as Francis Possenti in Assisi, Italy in 1838. As the eleventh of thirteen children, young Francis was similar to many children of his day. He lived a rather ordinary life but distinguished himself by the good nature. He was known for his serious devotion to prayer and contemplation. And even at a young age, felt the calling to lead a religious life. After much prayer and discernment, Francis joined the Passionists. Francis felt a calling for this religious life as the Passionists as he would devout his life to the study of the Passion of Christ and the Sorrow of Mary. The Passionsts lived a life of solitude, poverty and prayer. Sadly though, the young novice died of tuberculosis before reaching the age of 24, and one year before he would be ordained a priest. His feast day is celebrated on February 27 and he serves as the Patron Saint of Catholic youth, students, and young men studying for the priesthood

This Friday, February 28 is the deadline for re-enrollment for the 2020-2021 school year. For contracts signed anytime between March 1 - April 30, a \$100 late will be applied. After April 30, a \$200 late fee will be applied. So don't delay—re-register today!

Please note that all families must complete three items to be re-enrolled: a **Signed Contract**, a **Paid Deposit and** a **FACTS Payment Plan** set-up. These three items are due by February 28, 2020 in order to secure your child(ren's) spot for the 2020-21 school year. We do anticipate a waiting list for a few of our larger classes, so re-enroll today! Spots will be offered to new families starting on March 1, 2020.

Please note: If your family is behind in tuition and/or fees, your contract will not be issued until you become current with your financial obligation.
