October's Theme: The Dignity of the Human Person

Feast Day of our Faith

Today marks the feast day for St. John XVIII. As the Pontiff during one of the most instrumental events in the life of our Church, the Second Vatican Council (1962) was established as a means of spiritual renewal and as an occasion for Christians separated from the Church to join in search for reunion. During his opening remarks, Pope John XVIII advised the council members to use the work of the Council as an opportunity to meet the pastoral needs of the church. Moreover, by describing the church as the people of God, the council fathers provided the theological justification for changing the defensive and inflexible stance that had characterized much of Catholic thought and practice since the early 1500's.

The following reflection was shared by Pope John XVIII:

God desires us to follow the examples of the saints by absorbing the vital sap of their virtues and turning it into our own life-blood, adapting it to our own individual capacities and particular circumstances.

Hearing and Vision Screening: provided annually by the Baltimore County Health Department, has been delayed until April 26th and 27th. At that time, we will provide the screening to PreK4, 1st, 4th, and 8th grades, along with any students new to the Baltimore County school system or any Kindergarten students, not tested here in PreK4. For your reference, forms will be distributed prior to the dates. And please note that permission forms must be filled out and signed by parents, for any student to be screened. More details to follow later this spring.

Oral Health Impact Program: Parents will soon receive information on the "Oral Health Impact Program". As part of this program, a dentist and his assistant will be available at our school to exam the children's teeth. Prior to the dental examination, parents will be required to return a signed permission form. As soon as the forms are received, we will notify families of the scheduled examination date.
