And this is accomplished by more than a mere obedience to laws of our Catholic faith. Those who follow Christ and live by His Spirit understand that our eternal salvation rests upon our struggles and our pain. The difficulties we aim to overcome as loyal followers of Christ and the rewards which await us can be found in Matthew 5:3-10 (and also in Luke 6:20-26). These Beatitudes below are paraphrased in a way which both children and adults can relate:

- 1) Happy are those who need God.
- 2) Happy are those with self control.
- 3) Happy are those are sorry for their sin.
- 4) Happy are those who desire to be holy.
- 5) Happy are those who are forgiving and compassionate.
- 6) Happy are those who love with all their heart.
- 7) Happy are those who create communities of peace for others.
- 8) Happy are those who suffer for doing what is right.

The Beatitudes are the "synthesis" of Christ's teaching and describe ways of being and acting that are "fundamental" to followers of Christ.

Leadership Saint of the Week

St. Josephine Bakhita is a heroic saint who endured the horrors of slavery with bravery before she escaped into freedom through the Canossian Religious Sisters that she would join in her later life. Josephine was born around 1869 in Darfur (now part of western Sudan) to a loving, prosperous family. However, when Josephine was eight, she was snatched by slave traders and would eventually be sold to a string of owners who treated her with unspeakable, inhumane cruelty. In 1883, Bakhita was sold to a new, kinder owner—the Italian Consul to Sudan. Bakhita would later become a faithful nanny to the Michieli family's young daughter. In the fall of 1888, while the rest of the family was away on business, Bakhita and her young charge went to stay with the Canossian Sisters in Venice. While there, Bakhita encountered Christianity for the first time. Shortly thereafter, Bakhita was baptized and received the new name of Josephine in 1890. Three years later, she would enter the Canossian novitiate. After taking her vows, she was assigned to the Canossian convent in Schio and remained there for forty-two years. Her feast day is February 8 and she serves as the patron saint for survivors of human trafficking.

If you are applying for Financial Aid through the Archdiocese of Baltimore, please be aware that the deadline for applications is Friday, February 28th. You must apply through FACTS in order to be eligible for Financial Aid through the Archdiocese. Please click <u>HERE</u> to start the process.

Time for Re-Enrollment (Previously Posted)

Each family has received an email from School Admin with a link to log-in, review and sign your 2020-21 Contract. At the end of the contract, you will be prompted to pay the \$250 Enrollment Deposit per family. Once each contract is signed and your deposit is received, you will also need to complete your FACTS payment plan for the 2020-21 School Year (payments starting in July). These **THREE** things— **Contract, Deposit and FACTS**—are due by February 28, 2020 in order to secure your child(ren's) spot for the 2020-21 school year. We do anticipate a waiting list for a few of our larger classes, so don't delay! Spots will be offered to new families starting on March 1, 2020. Additionally, there is a \$100 late fee assessed for contracts signed after March 1, 2020. Please note: If your family is behind in tuition and/or fees, your contract will not be issued until you become current with your financial obligation.
