February Theme — Care for the Poor & Vulnerable

As we conclude our month's theme of the Care for the Poor and the Vulnerable, we look toward this Saturday and the celebration of the feast day for Saint Katharine Drexel as a life spent caring and serving those in need.

Born in 1858 into a prominent Philadelphia family, Katharine became imbued with love for God and neighbor. She took an avid interest in the material and spiritual well-being of black and native Americans. She began by donating money but soon concluded that more was needed – the lacking ingredient was people. Katharine founded the Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament for Black and Native American peoples, whose members would work for the betterment of those they were called to serve.

As a testimony to the mission of her work, St. Katharine Drexel is celebrated as the patron saint for racial justice and philanthropy.

Because of her lifelong dedication to her faith and her selfless service to the oppressed, Pope John Paul II canonized her on October 1, 2000 to become only the second recognized American-born saint.

School Safety

Moreover, we dedicate ourselves towards preparation, planning, practice and our partnership with community agencies. Each month, we rehearse our response to critical incidents with drills that range from fire, bomb threat, severe weather, earthquake, internal intruder lockdown, evacuation and parent reunification.

As the governing body of our Catholic school system, the Archdiocese of Baltimore responds to the topic of community safety with similar seriousness as does our local school.
