The Gift of the Holy Rosary

On Monday, our school community celebrated the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary. This feast day was established by Saint Pius V in 1573 and serves as a reminder that the purpose of the Rosary is to help us meditate on the great mysteries of our salvation. The main focus is on Jesus—his birth, life, death, and resurrection. The *Our Father* prayers remind us that Jesus' Father is the initiator of salvation. The *Hail Mary* prayers remind us to join with Mary in contemplating these mysteries. They also make us aware that Mary was and is intimately joined with her Son in all the mysteries of his earthly and heavenly existence. The *Glory Be* prayers remind us that the purpose of all life is the glory of the Trinity. The simple and constant repetition of the words in these prayers helps create an atmosphere in which to contemplate the mysteries of God. We sense that Jesus and Mary are with us in the joys and sorrows of life. We grow in hope that God will bring us to share in the glory of Jesus and Mary forever.

This year's theme, "The Year to Lead", invites us **MODEL the Way** of leadership. During our prayer service this week, our 8th and 1st grade prayer partners introduced our virtue trait for the month of October: Merciful. Each time we pray a decade of the rosary as a school, we conclude by asking Jesus to help all those who are most in need of his mercy. To put this into practice, each student will be creating a card for a resident of Mary's House, a pregnancy support home for expectant mothers. Please keep the families of Mary's House in your prayers.

Interim Reports—10/15

On Tuesday, October 15, students in grades 1-8 will be sent home with a copy of their Interim Progress Report.

Financial Obligations

As part of our school policy, any family who is not current with their financial obligations (tuition and/or fees) at any point in the year, is not eligible to receive a copy of their child's Interim Progress Report or Trimester Report Card, until at which time the family becomes current. For any parent with a payment that exceeds 30 days past due, that family will also lose access to the parent portal in Power School.

In reflection of the groundbreaking doctrines that emerged from Vatican II, Pope John XXIII said that "the Gospel did not change, only that we begun to understand it better." Saint John XXIII was a true visionary and a humble man of action.
