"And Peter went outside and wept bitterly." Luke 22:62

Has someone ever said to you, "You are too old to cry!"? In our scripture passage from Luke, Peter was a grown man who had just denied that he knew Jesus because he was afraid he would be arrested. When the Lord turned and looked straight at Peter, he felt so ashamed that he "went out and wept bitterly."
