All Hallows' Eve

The term Halloween is derived from the term All Hallows' Eve. This day serves as the vigil of The Solemnity of All Saints and is a major feast day on the Catholic Church's liturgical calendar. Thus, All Hallows' Eve is connected with All Saints Day (November 1st) and All Souls Day (November 2nd). This triduum of days taken together are often seen as days of honor for the dead.

While the activities surrounding Halloween are often seen as secular, Catholics will often use "All Hallows' Eve" as an occasion in which to prepare to honor all the saints in heaven as well as all the holy souls detained in purgatory on their way to heaven. So while tonight our students may celebrate the sweet taste of candy, tomorrow we will celebrate the sweet joy of the communion of saints!
