# **Feast Day for Saint Joseph the Worker**

Saint Joseph is such a significant figure in the eyes of the Catholic community that the Church has set aside two feast days for the foster father of Jesus. The first is March 19—for Joseph, the Husband of Mary. The second is today, May 1—for Joseph, the Worker. This latter feast day was established by Pope Pius XII in 1955.

Although little is referenced in Scripture of this humble man, we do know that Joseph was a carpenter who did not come from great wealth. Jesus, too, was a carpenter who learned the trade from Saint Joseph as the son of God spent his early adult years working side-by-side in Joseph's carpentry shop before leaving to pursue his ministry as a teacher, preacher and healer.

As the patron saint of the universal Church, Joseph served as the intimate model of community of family life and dignity of work to Jesus and today, continues to offer that same model to the members of our Christian faith.
