The Solemnity of the Baptism of the Lord

On Sunday, our faith community celebrated the Solemnity of the Baptism of the Lord. This blessed feast day brings to an end the Catholic liturgical season of Christmas and a return to Ordinary Time. For most of us, the Christmas season probably ended weeks ago. With the decorations likely packed away, and perhaps even some of your children's toys may already been broken, it may seem peculiar that Christmas officially ended on Sunday. However, the Catholic Church uses this feast day as the occasion in which to recall our Lord's second manifestation or epiphany, which occurred on the event of His baptism in the Jordan River.


"Many of the incidents which accompanied Christ's baptism are symbolical of what happened at our own Baptism. At Christ's baptism the Holy Spirit descended upon Him; at our Baptism the Trinity took its abode in our soul. At His baptism, Christ was proclaimed the "Beloved Son" of the Father; at our Baptism we become the adopted sons and daughters of God. At Christ's baptism the heavens were opened; at our Baptism heaven was opened to us. At His baptism Jesus prayed; after our Baptism we must pray to avoid actual sin."

Leadership Saint of the Week

St. Marguerite Bourgeoys serves as our Leadership Saint of the Week. Born in France in 1620 into a family with 12 children, Marguerite began her early life taking care of many of her brothers and sisters after her mother died when she was 19. The governor of Montreal, Canada, traveled to France looking for teachers willing to come to the New World and live in the Canadian wilderness. The challenges of hardship and danger of the wilderness inspired Marguerite. While there, she chose to serve the Native Americans and the settlers and convinced the governor of Ville Marie (Montreal) to let her open a school. When Marguerite first arrived in Ville Marie, she realized that children did not live to an age old enough for school. Therefore, she went to work in the hospital in helping children to survive in the harsh New World. She made several trips back to France to recruit more teachers, and these women joined her in forming the Congregation of Notre Dame. St. Marguerite was canonized in 1982 as Canada's first female saint and serves as the patron saint for the poor and impoverished.

Nurse's Notes

There has been a higher percentage of hospitalizations involving individuals diagnosed with "RSV" Respiratory syncytial virus. Early symptoms of RSV may include: runny nose, decrease in appetite, cough, which may progress to wheezing. RSV season occurs each year, so take extra precaution by doing the following: Wash your hands often; Keep your hands off your face; Avoid close contact with sick people; Cover your coughs and sneezes; Clean and disinfect surfaces; and Stay home when you are sick.
