All Saints Day and All Souls Day

During the year the Church celebrates, one by one, the feasts of the saints. On November 1, she joins them all in one festival called All Saints Day. This blessed day is a solemnity, a holyday of obligation and the day that the Church honors all of God's saints, even those who have not been canonized by the Church. Solemnities are counted as the principal days in the calendar and their observance begins with evening prayer of the preceding day.

November 2, the Feast of All Souls, is the date designated to pray for all the departed souls in Purgatory. In many countries this is an important day. Families cook special foods and make a special day's outing to cemeteries to tend to the graves, pray for the family dead.

The feasts of All Saints and All Souls fall back-to-back to express the Christian belief of the "Communion of Saints." Saints can intercede with God for those still on earth. Both the faithful on earth and the saints in heaven can pray for the souls in Purgatory. During these two days we see the Communion of Saints really in action.
