Traces shapes, numbers and letters

Cares for basic bathroom and dressing needs(wiping as hand washing)	
Is fully potty-trained, even during rest time	
Social and Emotional Skills	
Shows confidence in new experiences	
Easily separates from parents	
Demonstrates independence/chooses what he or she likes or dislikes	
Cooperates with other children in play/shares	
Cooperates with others joint activities	
Demonstrates the ability to take turns	
Waits patiently for short periods	
Negotiates solutions to conflict using words and not aggression
