# The Patroness of our School and Parish

Yesterday, our school and parish community celebrated the feast of St. Agnes of Rome (291-304). Agnes, which means pure, was raised in a noble Christian family. As legend tells us, Agnes was very beautiful. She wanted to remain a virgin and did not want to marry or give her body to another person. Her hand in marriage was highly sought after, and she had many high ranking men chasing after her. Whenever a man wished to marry Agnes, she would always say, "Jesus Christ is my only Spouse."

According to this legend, the young men she turned away became so insulted by her purity to God, that they began to submit her name to authorities as a Christian follower. In one incident, the Governor's son, became very angry when she refused him. In great anger, the son accused Agnes of being a Christian and brought her to his father, the Governor. Failing to convince her to renounce God, Agnes was sentenced to death.

Even though Agnes was only 13 years old, she courageously faced death and became a martyr for her belief in God. Agnes was heroic and took her virginity with her to God's kingdom. Because a lamb's wool is white and pure, the Church uses the symbol of a lamb for Agnes. She is the patron saint of chastity and engaged couples.

## Leadership Saint of the Week

St. Francis de Sales was born on August 21, 1567, at the Château de Sales in the kingdom of Savoy near Geneva, Switzerland. He came from a noble family and even as a child he desired to serve God completely. However, his father wanted him to pursue a career in law and politics and enter into an advantageous marriage. But Francis wanted to be a priest. Against his father's wishes he was ordained in 1593 by the Bishop of Geneva. At the time of the Protestant Reformation, Francis set out to restore Catholicism in the region around Lake Geneva known as Chablais. Tirelessly and patiently preaching the ancient faith, writing leaflets that clearly explained the Catholic view, he gradually re-established a strong Catholicism in that area. In 1602, he was appointed Bishop of Geneva.

Francis de Sales was convinced that God sees humanity as a great and varied garden, each person beautiful in his or her uniqueness. The various callings of life – soldier, prince, widow, married woman – are like the various flowers of the field; God loves them all. Francis approached people with genuine respect and gently guided them to recognize the unique path they would take in life. He made the journey to God joyful and possible for everyone to make.
