The "New (Liturgical) Year" is Coming!

Within the Catholic Church, the mystery of Christ is unfolded within six seasons of each liturgical year. Accordingly, Advent begins next Sunday, December 1 as we usher in our "new year".

- <u>Advent</u> four weeks of preparation before the celebration of Jesus' birth.
- <u>Christmas</u> recalling the Nativity of Jesus Christ and his manifestation to the peoples of the world.
- <u>Lent</u> a six-week period of penance before Easter.
- <u>Sacred Paschal Triduum</u> the holiest "Three Days" of the Church's year, where the Christian people recall the suffering, death, and resurrection of Jesus.
- <u>Easter</u> 50 days of joyful celebration of the Lord's resurrection from the dead and his sending forth of the Holy Spirit.
- Ordinary Time divided into two sections (one span of 4-8 weeks after Christmas Time and another lasting about six months after Easter Time), wherein the faithful consider the fullness of Jesus' teachings and works among his people.

Cultural Connections Experience—11/25

Please note that report cards will be sent home on Friday, December 6. And as a reminder, our school policy requires that families that have an outstanding tuition balance will not receive their child's report card until at which time their account becomes current.

Middle School Play

Auditions for this year's middle school musical production, "Golly Gee Whiz", will be on December 6 and December 9 in the cafeteria. The time for each of these auditions will be 3:15pm to 4:30pm. However, students will only need to attend one of these two audition dates. At the audition, the students will need to sing a song or part of a song (solo) and read from the script (in groups). Song choices will be available on the date of auditions—either Happy Birthday or a song that is sing at our school masses. Please note that casting will occur after auditions as the cast list will be announced and scripts will be given prior to Christmas break. And for your reference, rehearsals will begin in January.

Saint Cecilia was born to a wealthy Roman family and is said to have lived in the second century. As a Christian martyr, she spent much of her life converting pagans of her time to follow the beliefs of Catholic teachings. Although illegal at the time, her dedication to Catholic conversion and burying the Christian dead let to her arrest and was eventually sentenced to death. Using the gift of song as an instrument to celebrate the glory of God, Cecilia serves as the patron saint for musicians. Her feast day is November 22.
